Imagine what God can do through just one person who is obedient to His calling! A Scot who came to Christ in Geneva, Switzerland, at the turn of the 20th century, H.E. Alexander founded the **Geneva Bible Institute (Institut Biblique de Genève, or IBG)** in 1928 with 25 students. Teaching in the French language, the school has trained over 2,000 people, equipping many as pastors or lay leaders in the French-speaking world.

IBG offers a one-year intensive course of study in Bible with a strong mentoring component, followed by three years of internship in a local church. Most of the students come from France, Switzerland, or Belgium. But what about the many French speakers who desire to study, equipping themselves for ministry, but are unable to come to Geneva due to work or family commitments? Or because they live far from Geneva?

Several years ago IBG initiated discussions with eDOT about starting an online program that would enable those who wanted biblical training, as well as ministry interns, to study without the boundaries of time and distance. After months of collaboration, **IBG Online** is geared to enter the initial testing of the New Testament Survey course this month in preparation for the launch of IBG Online in October 2008. According to Bob Winslow, IBG Online director, Phase I of this program will offer 12 courses, the equivalent of the initial one-year certificate, to French speakers in Europe. Phase II will offer these courses to 100 pastors-in-training in French-speaking Senegal and Rwanda.

The potential for a French online Bible program is enormous! French is spoken, either as a native or second language, by about 350 million people in 54 countries. That's why eDOT has been eager to help IBG Online on all levels - offering Moodle training and support, technology consultation, and globalized course material. French speakers throughout the world will be able to enroll and access the course material hosted on eDOT's server. Final preparations remain - linking Bible references to an online Bible, creating a tutorial video for Moodle using screen-capture software, and making an introductory video from the IBG director.



Anyone who has been involved in the start of a new project realizes the tremendous hurdles that have to be overcome to launch a program this large!
