Equipping Cross-Cultural Trainers

In beautiful Hertfordshire, just north of London, All Nations Christian College trains over 100 people of all ages - 18 to 60-plus! - each year for cross-cultural missions. As an independent, evangelical training Bible college, All Nations is the largest college of its type in Europe. Several years ago, All Nations contacted eDOT for help in developing an eLearning program. Though students from over 30 different countries now study on campus, visionaries at the school saw the potential of using their training materials online so that even more students could benefit from the practical cross-cultural training.



All Nations Christian College is the largest European college offering cross-cultural ministry training.

Rich and Larry, eDOT colleagues, made several trips to England to discuss a partnership in this project. This led to three ANCC staff members taking eDOT's Facilitator Training course in the fall of 2007. Taking eDOT's course gave them the tools they needed to begin developing their own online program. They had the opportunity to become familiar with Moodle, a software program often used in the virtual learning environment. The experience of participating in an eLearning course which uses discussion as the main method of learning - something quite new to most people - and the engagement with other students from around the world within a virtual community gave them a basis from which they could move forward. "en route" which was offered for the first time in September 2008, with plans to offer it again in January and April 2009. Six students are currently enrolled in the 14-week course which provides them with a foundation in cross-cultural service and allows them the freedom of taking the course wherever they live at a much-reduced cost.
